About the Authors

MAJOR RUSTY BRADLEY was wounded during the Battle of Sperwan Ghar in command of a Special Forces A-team, on his third combat tour as a Special Forces team leader. A native of North Carolina, he graduated from Mars Hill College and enlisted in the Army in 1993, serving as an infantryman for six years before earning his commission from Officer Candidate School in 1999. In 2014, Major Bradley was medically retired after twenty-one years of service. He deployed eight times to Afghanistan.

That war is over. I am not sure how I feel about Afghanistan anymore. Honestly, I am not sure I ever will know how I feel about that place.

I am asked if it was worth it all the time. If that question had been posed before 2008, I would have said yes. We were there to seek vengeance on behalf of the nation and to ensure that the country would never again become a staging ground for terrorists. We had the full support of the White House and the administration. If we needed something, all we had to do was ask. If that question was posed after 2008, I would say no. It was and still is an unconventional war fought against terrorists and extremist ideology. To the enemies of our nation, I simply regret that I have not removed more of you from this earth. You love death as much as we love life. We know this. We Americans have longer memories than you give us credit for. Consider my words carefully, and be warned. Televisions may display our internal strife on the international news, but we will not tolerate your inhumanity or terrorism. You cannot slay the innocent without retaliation or reciprocity. Weak leaders are always followed by strong ones. Our nation's reputation stands in the history books.
